

Whereas, the cost-effective, safe, and quality health services provided by registered nurses will be an ever more important component of the America health care delivery in the future, and





July 4, 2014 two minutes into the firework program, a mortar tube fail causing the shell to explode on the ground causing significant blunt force trauma to the field technicians in the area. Fire and EMS crews were alerted to the situation and upon arrival found fires and injured victims. Nearly all the mortars were live shells waiting to be ignited and could have gone off when the crews were operating in the area to rescue the injured and put out those fires. One patient in particular had significant trauma requiring immediate treatment in a hazardous area. Police and Fire departments worked well together controlling and directing traffic allowing med units to get to the injured ASAP.
