

**CITY OF FRANKLIN
COMMON COUNCIL MEETING
JUNE 22, 2004
MINUTES**

- CALL TO ORDER A. Mayor Klimetz called the regular Common Council meeting of June 22, 2004 to order at 6:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers of Franklin City Hall, 9229 W. Loomis Road, Franklin, Wisconsin.
- Present were: Mayor Klimetz, Aldermen Olson, Solomon, Gardner, Kosovich, Sohns and Bergmann. Also present were Assistant City Engineer Romeis, Dir. of Admin. Petre, City Attorney Wesolowski and City Clerk Wesolowski.
- CITIZEN COMMENT B. Citizen comment period was opened at 6:34 p.m. and closed at 7:55 p.m.
- Mayor Klimetz announced the results of the Great Tree Hunt conducted by the Franklin Environmental Commission and presented certificates and prizes to contest winners.
