SPECIAL COMMON COUNCIL MEETING
JUNE 29, 2005
MINUTES

- CALL TO ORDER I. Mayor Taylor called the special Common Council meeting of June 29, 2005 to order at 6:00 p.m. in the Hearing Room of Franklin City Hall, 9229 W. Loomis Road, Franklin, Wisconsin.
- ROLL CALL I. Present were: Mayor Taylor, Aldermen Olson, Solomon, Hammelman, Kosovich, Sohns (arrived at 6:08 p.m.) and Skowronski. Also present were Dir. of Admin. Petre, City Attorney Wesolowski, Casper Green, Ted Grintjes, and Deb Jensen-DeHart of the Franklin HUB.
- CITIZEN COMMENT II. None
- VISIONING PLAN IMPLEMENTATION RECOMMENDATIONS III. Alderman Olson moved to suspend regular order of business as it relates to Parliamentary Procedures and open the meeting for discussion. Seconded by Alderman Solomon. All voted Aye; motion carried.
- The Common Council Members discussed:
- The need for the Ryan Creek Interceptor.
 - Came to consensus that the 70/30 ratio of residential to commercial valuation is still a priority.
 - Residents desire for lower taxes and increased retail development.
 - Role of Common Council as it relates to direction to Boards and Commissions.
- Alderman Olson moved that it remain a goal of the Common Council to obtain the 70/30 ratio of residential to commercial assessed valuation. Seconded by Alderman Solomon. All voted Aye; motion carried.
- The Common Council members reviewed Section I (Planning, Community Development, and Economic Development) of the MSA Report and discussed the individual 15 items within Section I. The Common Council Members proceeded to review Section II (Parks, Recreation & Leisure) and discussed the individual 14 items within Section II. Various changes were made to items within these two sections.
- The Common Council came to consensus to change the Mission Statement, to insert the word “safety” into the text of the Statement before the word “small” in the last sentence.
- ADJOURNMENT IV. Alderman Skowronski moved to adjourn the special Common Council meeting at 7:58 p.m. Seconded by Alderman Hammelman. All voted Aye; motion carried.
