

**MINUTES
SPECIAL COMMON COUNCIL MEETING
CITY OF FRANKLIN
APRIL 1, 2006**

ROLL CALL

- I. The special meeting of the Common Council was held on April 1, 2006 and was called to order at 1:00 p.m. by Mayor Taylor in the Franklin Public Library, 9151 West Loomis Road, Franklin, Wisconsin. On roll call, the following were in attendance: Aldermen Olson, Solomon, Hammelman, Kosovich and Sohns. Excused was Alderman Skowronski. Also present were Police Chief Oliva, Police Inspector Hahn, City Attorney Wesolowski and City Clerk Wesolowski.

Mayor Taylor, Police Chief Oliva and City Attorney Wesolowski presented community notification of registered sex offender information, including the regular whereabouts of a registered sex offender, including the location of being employed or carrying on a vocation by a registered sex offender, and additionally including such information as it relates to the property at South 8135 on STH 100, and including the monitoring of and housing of persons committed to the custody of the Department of Health and Family Services under Chapter 980 of the Wisconsin Statutes.
