

**CITY OF FRANKLIN
SPECIAL COMMON COUNCIL MEETING
MARCH 6, 2010
MINUTES**

ROLL CALL

- I. The special meeting of the Common Council was held on March 6, 2010 and called to order at 4:30 p.m. by Mayor Taylor in the Common Council Chambers at Franklin City Hall, 9229 West Loomis Road, Franklin, Wisconsin. On roll call, the following were in attendance: Aldermen Olson, Solomon, Wilhelm, Taylor, Sohns and Skowronski. Also present were Police Chief Oliva, Police Inspector Hahn, City Attorney Wesolowski and City Clerk Wesolowski.

- III. Alderman Solomon moved to authorize the expenditure of up to \$25,000 (along with direction that a detailed accounting be provided of the funds) to undertake communications to and with the Community, State Legislators, Schools, Churches, Parks and Recreational facilities and other municipalities, to inform them of 2009 Senate Bill 548 and 2009 Assembly Bill 759, pre-empting cities, villages and towns from enacting and enforcing sex offender residency restriction and child safety zone ordinances; to direct staff to research other municipalities who have ordinances on file; and further that letters be sent to all of those municipalities. Seconded by Alderman Taylor. All voted Aye; motion carried.

Upon recommendation of the Community Safety Response Task Force, Alderman Sohns moved to authorize the Mayor, Alderman Olson, Chief Oliva and any others designated by the Mayor, with encouragement to all Common Council members, to speak on behalf of the citizens of Franklin at the public hearing before the Assembly on Thursday, March 11, 2010, and any subsequent hearings before Senate, and to advocate that citizens either travel to Madison, make phone calls or send emails to their representatives in opposition to Senate Bill 548 and Assembly Bill 759. Seconded by Alderman Solomon. All voted Aye; motion carried.
