Also present were City Engineer Bennett, Director of Administration Luberda, City Attorney Wesolowski and City Clerk Wesolowski.

RECOGNITION- PARKING LOT PROJECTS	B.2.a.	Highway Superintendent Schaefer and Department of Public Works, along with Assistant City Engineer Romeis and Engineering Technician Asuncion, were recognized for their work on the City Hall and Fire Department parking lot projects.
APPROVAL OF MINUTES-10/4/11	C.1.	Alderman Skowronski moved to approve the minutes of the regular meeting of October 4, 2011, as corrected. Seconded by Alderman Olson. All voted Aye; motion carried.
APPOINTMENTS	E.1.a.	Alderman Skowronski moved to approve the Mayoral appointment of Daniel Andres to the Environmental Commission, term expires 4/30/14. Seconded by Alderman Schmidt. Alderman Wilhelm moved that an Ordinance to amend the Municipal Code as it pertains to the carrying of concealed weapons within the City and certain City buildings be tabled to the Committee of the Whole meeting on October 31, 2011, to allow the City Attorney, the Police Chief, and the Director of Administration to provide a written determination on insurance liability details, constituent input, and an employee policy prior to action on the Ordinance. Motion died due to the lack of a second. Alderman Skowronski then moved to not adopt an Ordinance to amend the Municipal Code as it pertains to the carrying of concealed weapons within the City and certain City buildings. Seconded by Alderman Solomon.

At 7:25 p.m., Acting Mayor Taylor passed the gavel to Acting Council President Schmidt, who then chaired the meeting. The gavel was returned to Acting Mayor Taylor at 7:27 p.m., who returned to chairing the meeting.

Alderman Skowronski withdrew his motion to not adopt the Ordinance. Alderman Skowronski then moved to direct the City
