## Why Franklin?

Franklin's business focus took shape with the creation of the 635 acre Franklin Business and Industrial Parks in the 1990's. The approach continues today, as Franklin consistently rates as one of Wisconsin's fastest growing communities. There are plenty of reasons major companies like Northwestern Mutual, Wheaton Franciscan Healthcare, Kronos, Baptista's Bakery, Vesta, Carlisle Interconnect Technologies, Carmex, Central Aquatics, Proteus Packaging, and Transpak call Franklin home.

**High quality infrastructure** and services provide access to public sewer, water and storm water conveyance systems throughout the City. Strategic investments, like the Ryan Creek Sewer Interceptor, have opened new development opportunities and demonstrate regional collaboration and plans for growth.

**Ideally located** within the Milwaukee-Chicago corridor, Franklin has easy access to Interstates 94, 894, 43 and 41, as well as Gen. Mitchell International Airport (5 miles). Well maintained roads, including U.S. Highways and State and County Trunk Highways, are rated among the best in Milwaukee County and ensure Franklin moves at the speed of business.

**Putting business needs first**, Franklin is prepared to support expansion and relocation efforts. The City offers weekly development review team meetings, a streamlined review process, active tax-increment finance districts and a highly engaged team of economic development, planning, engineering and inspection professionals.

**Space to grow** in Franklin is plentiful with 21 square miles (61%) of the City undeveloped. Between 1970 and 2000, Franklin's population more than doubled and the City continues to be one of the fastest growing suburbs in Southeastern Wisconsin. The WI Department of Administration predicts Franklin will be the fastest growing community in Milwaukee County with 29% growth between 2000 and 2040. Aware of natural assets, Franklin works strategically to identify growth opportunities and assist developers in preserving the character and beauty of City's environmental features.

**Creating a high-quality of life** for Franklin businesses and residents is of the highest priority. Franklin is proud of its many community assets and works diligently to meet the standards set by our engaged citizenry. From top rated schools and public safety providers to development and environmental standards, Franklin ensures a standard of quality will remain in the community for generations to come.

**Family focused** means the City is a safe and welcoming community for residents and employees. High performing schools and quality recreation and natural areas are at the heart of creating an ideal setting to live, work and play. ## Resources & Incentives

Franklin is experienced working with development projects of all scales and is ready to assist in accessing available resources and incentives. While some resources are industry specific, city staff can help explore local, regional and state programs that may support your project.

**Industrial revenue bonds** are offered to businesses to finance capital investments and job creation in Franklin. The sale of tax-exempt bonds can be used to fund building, equipment, land and bond issuance costs at interest rates that are lower than conventional bank loans.

**Tax increment finance districts** leverages the tax increment generated by a development to offset investments made in infrastructure and other development related expenses. TIF districts have previously been used to create the Franklin Business Park and attract businesses like Northwestern Mutual & Wheaton Franciscan Healthcare. New TIF districts have been explored to catalyze commercial, industrial and mixed-use developments throughout Franklin. An active TIF is available to support development near 27th Street & Oakwood Avenue.

**Weekly development review team meetings** offer developers the opportunity to review concepts with planners, engineers, inspectors, fire officials and legal council in a single session. The Mayor and District Alderperson may be available upon request. Meeting City staff early in the process, helps build relationships and create an environment to share ideas, get questions answered and keep projects on track.
