Attached is the 2020 Q1 Parks report. While park permit fees are comparable to Q1 2019, costs are dramatically higher in 2020 than 2019, when \$50,181 has been spent compared to \$24,148 in 2019. Check with Kevin why that is.

On the Capital side of things, in the Capital Improvement Fund, note that expenditures are ongoing for General Park Development, Pleasant View Pavilion, Pleasant View park equipment, and Master Plan Update.
