Investing in business growth and expansion

The city's Economic Development team, city staff, and elected officials have been strong partners in attracting new development to Franklin and helping existing companies expand. This includes investing tax incremental financing funds into major projects across the city.

- In the Franklin Business Park, **Yaskawa America Inc.** has announced a major expansion project, including 1,000 jobs and a \$182 million investment. Over 875,000 square feet of existing and new space will be developed and redeveloped including four new and two expanded and refitted buildings, including manufacturing, warehousing, R&D and headquarters facilities, as well as two parking ramps.
- ✓ Establishing TID 9 was instrumental in making the Carma Labs headquarters, production and warehousing project a reality and enabling new industrial, commercial, institutional, and residential uses yet to come. Franklin provided \$1.8 million in TIF support for extended sewer and water lines.
- ✓ We are also helping Modine Manufacturing grow locally with a new 153,000 square foot facility to produce thermal management systems used in specialty and commercial electric vehicles. The City of Franklin has offered \$1.6 million in TIF to support the development.







Making planning a priority

The Economic Development Commission (EDC) is putting a laser focus on drafting its final report recommendations for economic development strategic planning, for the first time in city history. The EDC is partnering with CP2 Consulting to develop a strategic economic development action plan to be released in 2025. The plan will help us prioritize our work and sharpen our tools to attract and retain businesses, so that we are a faster, more effective development community.

Final Report Recommendations

Stepping up our recruiting efforts

We can't do this alone. That is why we have strengthened partnerships with organizations like M7 and the Wisconsin Economic

Development Corp., and with developers like HSA and Wangard to attract new projects to Franklin and make them a reality. We also promoted the city as an economic

development destination with a new Economic Development
Guide, and have attended key recruiting events like the
International Manufacturing Technology Show.

Key projects have followed. In the Franklin Corporate Park,

Saputo Cheese USA Inc. has opened its new cheese processing
and packaging facility. And we welcome Ghana's Niche Cocoa

Services, building its first North American facility in Franklin.

Connecting workers with jobs

Workforce transportation is critical to our city's economic development success. That is why city leaders have actively supported the continued growth of FlexRide Milwaukee, a Wisconsin Policy Forum award-winning on-demand transportation service connecting workers from the City of Milwaukee with jobs in Franklin and the Franklin Business Park. We also continue to advocate for expanded Milwaukee County Transit Service to Franklin – an effort paying off with new routes as part of its MOVE 2025 initiative.







Investing in tourism

We are investing to make Franklin a tourism destination. The Tourism Commission (TC) partnered with a local advertising agency on a tourism study, giving us a roadmap of opportunities for investment. The TC has contracted with Engage Franklin to lead on destination marketing, and that investment is already paying off.

Growth continues at Ballpark Commons, including the opening of Luxe Golf, MainStay Suites and Sleep Inn & Suites, and food options like the Brick Pizzeria & Ristorante and Dog Haus. New attractions like Enchant Christmas and the Tacos and Tequila Festival have attracted tens of thousands of visitors to our city.

At Croatian Park, the facility's new 6,000 square-foot pavilion will be complete in 2025, and future plans include upgrading the bakery and kitchens, to host more and larger events and celebrations.

The Croatian Eagles Soccer Club is planning construction of a 122,000 square foot artificial turf field, backed in part by a \$100,000 investment from the Tourism Commission. The state-of-the-art-field will enable the soccer club to extend their season, increase daily play time and attract more regional and international tournaments. These events will generate more overnight stays and retail activity in Franklin.
