

NOTICE OF EFFECT OF CROSSOVER VOTING IN A PARTISAN PRIMARY IN WISCONSIN

Electors may vote for candidates of only one political party. Select a political party ballot from the party preference section at the beginning of the ballot. Connect the arrow or fill in the oval in the space designated for the ballot of your choice. If you designate a party preference, and then cast a vote for a candidate in another party or write in a name under another party, only those votes cast for candidates of the party designated will count.

If you do not designate a party preference, and vote for candidates of more than one party or write in a name under another party, none of your votes will be counted.

You must cast a vote for individual candidates.

This notice is posted at polling places using optical scan voting equipment. Consolidated paper ballots may not be used at a partisan primary.

It is recommended that the information on this form be printed on durable paper with minimum dimensions of 14" x 9½".
