The Director of Inspection Services serves as one of several department head positions for the City of Franklin. The position supervises a department staffed with seven (7) full-time employees consisting of a Chief Building Inspector, Building Inspector, Chief Electrical Inspector, Chief Plumbing Inspector, Permit Technician, Permit Coordinator, and Secretary. The ideal candidate will continue the department's successful efforts to evaluate current resources and deploy staff in a manner to provide effective and efficient Building Inspection Services. The successful candidate will be appointed by the Mayor, confirmed by the Common Council, and report to the Director of Administration.

A Bachelor's Degree and 5 years of building inspection experience is required, but the City reserves the right to consider any equivalent combination of education and experience that the City determines is appropriate. Previous supervisory experience is highly desirable. State of Wisconsin, Department of Safety and Professional Services (DSPS) certifications in Commercial Buildings, UDC-Construction, and UDC-HVAC are required, while UDC/Commercial Plumbing and UDC Electrical certifications are a plus. A valid driver's license is required. The approved salary range is \$76,716 to \$101,649, with a hiring rate dependent upon experience.
