- I. The meeting of the Tourism Commission was called to order by Chair Schermetzler at 6:00 p.m.
- II. The floor was opened for citizen comment and closed at 6:01 p.m.
- III. Wylie moved, supported by Marefka, to approve the minutes from the July 15th, 2020 meeting. Motion carried.
- IV. Wylie moved, supported by Marefka, to approve the minutes from the July 22nd, 2020 meeting. Motion carried.

- VIII. Berg informed the commission that the Finance Committee would be recommending an increase of room tax from 6% to 8% for the 2021 budget.
 - IX. Schermetzler informed the commission that the final invoice for the web page was received from THIEL and that she and Berg would meet with THIEL to go over scope of work and ensure all components have been completed.
 - X. Berg informed the commission that there was some question by Council as to the use of the Franklin name for Engage Franklin activities. Berg will ask Attorney Weselowski for an opinion.
