CITY OF FRANKLIN PARKS COMMISSION REGULAR MEETING AND PARKS TOUR MINUTES March 14, 2022

CALL TO ORDER

 Chair Michael Wrench called the March 14, 2022 Parks Commission regular meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. in the Hearing Room at Franklin City Hall located at 9229 W. Loomis Road, Franklin, Wisconsin.

Present were Chair Michael Wrench, Vice Chair David Bartels, Alderwoman Shari Hanneman, Commissioners Mary Remington, Karen Malecki, Janice Coenen and Ex-Officio member Michelle Runte. Also present were Department of Public Works Kevin Schlueter and Dale Borchardt, City Engineer Glen Morrow, Alderman Dan Mayer, Alderman Mike Barber and Alderwoman Kristen Wilhelm and Associate Planner Marion Ecks. Request by Alderman Daniel M. Mayer to install a flagpole in Market Square Park, located at 11230 West Franklin Street.

Request by Thomas Wilde, City of Franklin resident, to install birdhouses in Ernie Lake Park, located at 8000 South Chapel Hill Drive.

Franklin Community Education and Recreation Department request to reserve the pickleball courts, at Lions Legend II Park, for spring and summer 2022 programs. Requested dates are for Monday through Thursday evenings (5:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.) April 18, through June 16, 2022, and June 27, through August 18, 2022; and Saturday mornings (9:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.)

Recommendation to Common Council to pursue the purchase of approximately 40 acres of parkland adjacent to the western boundary of the Franklin Savanna State Natural Area on West Oakwood Road. **G.** Alderwoman Hanneman moved and Commissioner Remington seconded a motion to recommend to Common Council to express interest in purchasing 73 acres adjacent to Franklin Savanah as identified in the CORP and to direct staff to explore financial ability and present in April's meeting. On voice vote, 5 vote 'aye' and 1 voted 'nay'. Motion carried (5-1-0).

2022 Budget. Parks Commission request for information on personnel additions, Capital Outlay Fund needs, Equipment Revolving Fund needs, Street Improvement Fund needs and Major Capital Expenditures to be made with borrowed funds. Park amenities including ice skating rink.

Proposal to purchase property located at 9530 W. Loomis Rd., and approximately 9600 W. Loomis Rd. (Tax Key No. 840-9973-000, 840-9977-012, and 840-9977-009). Stat. § 19.85(1)(e), for market competition and bargaining reasons, to consider the potential acquisition of property to be used for public park purposes in the City, and to reenter open session at the same place thereafter to act on such matters discussed therein as it deems appropriate
