In addition, an email from the Greendale Police Department describing their actions when a complaint is filed, which when checking the monitors, does not meet the requirements to give a citation. The current decibel level is 79-Recommendations to the City on the sound complaints about The Rock Sports Complex.

- 1. Meet with Rock Representatives to review and discuss the complaints.
- 2. Seek a voluntary reduction in noise levels to that allowed in residential areas based on current research for quality of life.
- 3. Remove any City owned monitors from the Rock Sports Complex and place on neighboring residential properties.
- 4. Look into an online monitoring system.
- 5. Make sure there is regular calibration.

If unable to reach a voluntary agreement

- Stop all special permits for fireworks
- Stop all permits for evening concerts
- Stop all permits for events taking place after sunset.

Motioned by Vice Chair- Cieslak, seconded by Commissioner Sharma. On voice vote, all voted 'aye'. Motion carried (5-0-0).
