Minutes

I. The March 25, 2026 Police & Fire Commission Meeting was called to order at 12:17pm by Commission President Mineo in the Franklin City Hall Inspection Conference Room. Members present were Commissioners Mineo, Donohoo, Martins, and Schnagl. Commissioner Klusman was excused. Also in attendance were Director of Administration Hersh, Human Resources Administrator Wieting, Fire Chief James Mayer, Assistant EMS Chief Shannon Anthoine, Police Chief Craig Liermann, AC Eric Stowers, and City Attorney Jesse Wesolowski.

II. Approval of the Minutes of the 02/12/2026 meeting: Motion by Commissioner Donohoo and seconded by Commissioner Martins to approve the minutes from 02/12/2026 as amended. Motion to correct last meeting's attendance (Kathy Schnagl should be excused, not absent). Motion Carried: Ayes – All.

III. The creation of the 2026 police officer eligibility list for new officers and current existing Officers. Motion by Commissioner Schnagl and seconded by Commissioner Martins. Motion carried: Ayes - All.

IV. Appointment of new hire Firefighter/Paramedic Jacob Young. Motion by Commissioner Schnagl and seconded by Commissioner Martins. Motion Carried: Ayes - All.

V. Promotion of Firefighter/Paramedic Derek Hyde to Lieutenant. Motion by Commissioner Donohoo and seconded by Commissioner Schnagl. Motion Carried: Ayes - All.

VI. The Police and Fire Commission may enter into closed session under WI State Statute 19.85(1)(c) Considering employment, promotion, compensation or performance evaluation data of any public employee over which the governmental body has jurisdiction or exercises responsibility, 19.85(1)(f) Considering financial, medical, social or personal histories or disciplinary data of specific persons, preliminary consideration of specific personnel problems or the investigation of charges against specific persons except where par. (b) applies which, if discussed in public, would be likely to have a substantial adverse effect upon the reputation of any person referred to in such histories or data, or involved in such problems or investigations and 19.85(1)(g) Conferring with legal counsel for the governmental body who is rendering oral or written advice concerning strategy to be adopted by the body with respect to litigation in which it is or is likely to become involved, specifically regarding: complaint against Police Department personnel.

The Commission stayed in open session. Commissioner Donohoo motioned to dismiss without prejudice based on procedures adopted by the commission. Agenda item tabled.
