WHOLESALE PUBLIC WATER SUPPLY TO FRANKLIN 2024:

AGREEMENT WITH JEFF STONEBoard reviewed and discussed Jeff Stone's service agreementFOR ON-CALL SERVICES:proposal.

Commissioner Takerian moved to approve the agreement with Jeff Stone & Associates LLC for services related to obtaining a future public water service supply and supplier for Franklin. Seconded by Commissioner Graef. On roll call, all voted Aye. Motion carried.

KAEMPFER & ASSOCIATES FOR WATER TOWER STUDY: Manager Morrow indicated he anticipated this contract proposal would be paid for by water impact fees; but discovered it could not because it is not an actual project yet. Board reviewed and discussed water system storage proposal as presented by Kaempfer & Associates. Preproject costs to be covered with motion at next month's meeting.
