Superintendent Roberts reported that Utility is operating at a good level. A 12" gate valve was repaired this past month and he is going to get more aggressive with the Meter Change Out Program by adding another tech to change out meters.

Commissioner Takerian moved to enter closed session at 5:19 p.m. pursuant to Wis. Stat § 19.85(1)(g) to deliberate upon and to confer with legal counsel for the Board who is rendering advice concerning strategy to be adopted by the Board with regard to litigation upon the Application of the City of Oak Creek, as a Water Public Utility, for Authority to Construct Pumping and Water Storage Improvements and New Disinfection Facilities, in the City of Oak Creek, Milwaukee County, Wisconsin, and to reenter open session at the same place thereafter to act on such matters discussed therein as it deems appropriate. Seconded by Commissioner Peterson. On roll call, all voted Aye; motion carried.

Commissioner Schubilske moved to reconvene in open session at 5:39 p.m. Seconded by Commissioner Peterson. On roll call, all voted Aye. Motion carried.

WHOLESALE PUBLIC WATER SUPPLY TO FRANKLIN 2024:

Stat § 19.85(1)(e) to deliberate upon information, terms and provisions of the potential provision of public water supply to the City of Franklin as related to the City, the Franklin Municipal Water Utility and its customers in 2024 and beyond; and the potential negotiation of terms in relation thereto, including, but not limited to potential amendments to the Agreement for Oak Creek to Provide Water at Wholesale to Franklin, potential agreement terms with alternate public water supply sources, and the investing of public funds and governmental actions in relation thereto, for competitive and bargaining reasons, and to reenter open session at the same place thereafter to act on such matters discussed therein as it deems appropriate. Seconded by Commissioner Graef. On roll call, all voted Aye; motion carried.

Commissioner Graef moved to reconvene in open session at 6:21 p.m. Seconded by Commissioner Peterson. On roll call, all voted Aye. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS MILWAUKEE SCHOOL OF ENGINEERING PROJECT:

Manager Morrow informed the Board that he presented the Purple Pipe System to a Senior Design class at Milwaukee School of Engineering (MSOE) and they would like to make it a Senior Design class project this year.

Commissioner Graef moved to allow Manager Morrow to spend \$1,400 for the MSOE Senior Design class to work on a Purple Pipe System for the City of Franklin as a class project. Seconded by Commissioner Peterson. On roll call, all voted Aye. Motion carried.
