Parade participants should plan to arrive at the Police Department parking lot by 11:30 am. Parking is available in the lots of closed local businesses. Parking is not available at Aurora

Dogs: Prohibited From Being At-Large and Please Pick Up After Them!

We need your help in keeping our parks and public and/or private premises clean and safe for all!



City Code prohibits any dog from going upon

any public area or private premise without the permission of the owner of the premises. It also prohibits dogs to be at-large—requiring that any person accompanying a dog off the premises of its owner to have the dog on a leash and to carry a waste deposit receptacle to immediately remove and dispose of any dog waste left on any public or private premise.

The City of Franklin has gone to great lengths to make cleaning up after your dog convenient by providing dog waste receptacles and plastic bags at several locations along the paths in the parks. Please use these waste receptacles. You may be ticketed if caught leaving dog waste in the parks and public or private premises.

Go With The Flow: Keep Your Sewer Lateral Running Smoothly

What exactly does a homeowner own? A house and the property it sits on, right? Yes, but there's more—and most homeowners don't realize it.

If you own a home, you also own the sewer lateral pipe under it. That's the pipe under your house that carries used water from all your drains to the City's main sewer line. Every day, the wastewater generated from washing hands, cooking, taking showers, doing laundry, and flushing toilets is uneventfully carried away from the home through a series of pipes, never to be seen again. It's the proverbial "out of sight, out of mind" situation. But the truth is that, as your home's sewer lateral ages, defects can develop. Cracks, sags in the pipe joints, and root intrusions can allow groundwater, also called clearwater, to enter your lateral. This excess clearwater can overwhelm your lateral during storms or periods of high groundwater, increasing your risk of a basement sewer backup. Connected downspouts and foundation drains can also contribute excess clearwater to your lateral. And since that lateral-from where it begins right under your home to where it connects to the sewer main-belongs to you, it's your responsibility to maintain it. That means everything from doing right by your lateral every day to having it checked out in case it has issues.

Be nice to your pipes. Keep things flowing by being aware of what to do and not to do:

- DON'T pour grease, fats, or oils down the drain. They accumulate and cause backups.
- DON'T try to flush wipes, paper towels, or feminine products. They can cause serious clogs.

Next, consider having your lateral examined. If you have slow-downs or backups, or if you've never had your sewer lateral inspected and would like to, consider having a plumber perform a video inspection. Plumbers should be called for:

- Slow-running drains or toilets;
- Sewer water backing up through the floor drain or other plumbing fixtures;
- Debris around the floor drain, which may be evidence of water backups occurring.

Additionally, the City can check the flow rate of the sanitary sewer main in front of your home. Any issues there are the City's responsibility and will be remedied. To discuss, call 414-421-2613.

Watch for more help. All year long, the City works on behalf of its homeowners to extend help for home maintenance needs, including laterals. Watch for more information in future issues of the Franklin City Newsletter under the title "Laterally Speaking".

Staying on top of needed improvements to your home's sewer lateral not only reduces the risk of basement backups for you and your neighbors, it also improves the function of your local public sewer system. And that means sewer lateral awareness can go back to where we prefer it—out of sight and out of mind.

Milwaukee County Home Repair

The Milwaukee County Housing Division offers no-interest loans to incomequalified homeowners in the suburban communities of Milwaukee County, *excluding* the Village of River Hills and the Cities of Milwaukee and West Allis, through



Cities of Milwaukee and West Allis, through its Home Repair Program. Loans or grants are available through the program.

Owner-occupied homes are eligible if the homeowner(s) meet income guidelines and property requirements (see income guidelines in the chart below). These funds can be used to make emergency repairs, correct code violations, or improve the living quality of your home. Common items repaired include hot water heaters, furnaces, sewer laterals, roofs, siding, trim, windows, porches, foundations, plumbing, and electrical. Projects funded by Home Repair loans will be secured by a lien on the home.

Program staff will help you through the application process, work with you to create a scope of work, and screen contractors to make sure they are right for your project. Once a contractor is selected, program staff put together an agreement with the contractor and oversee the project while in progress. Upon completion, the County pays the contractor directly. The homeowner repays the County according to the terms of the loan.

The City of Franklin has been awarded grant funds specific to residents of Franklin. For residents who qualify, a portion of the project cost could be covered by the City's grant funds. Grant amounts may be up to half the project cost, generally targeted for up to \$5,000, and do not have to be paid back.
