Credit Card Payment Option Now Available for Sewer/Water Bills, Building Inspection Services, and Other Miscellaneous Receivables

The City has engaged Invoice Cloud to make additional payment options available for payment of Sewer/Water Bills, Building Inspection Services invoices, and other Miscellaneous Receivable invoices such as solid waste fees, weed cutting charges, weights and measures, and fire inspections. The payment options include credit card payment and ACH electronic checks, among others. You can access these payment features by clicking the "Payments" button from the home page of the City's website at www.franklinwi.gov. Service fees do apply based on the transaction type chosen and are non-refundable.

For Sewer/Water bills, a PIN number that appears on your most recent utility bill provides security over your account. If requested, Invoice Cloud will email the bill directly to you, or make the bill available on your phone. Billing history is also available. When you sign up with Invoice Cloud, you will receive various email reminders of the bill and its due dates. There is a fee for this service, but if you choose the "recurring automated payment" option, there is NO fee. You can cancel the automated payment option at any time. See your next Sewer/Water bill for a reminder of these new payment options!



Inspection Services Now Offering Online Permit Application Option for Licensed Contractors

The City of Franklin recently upgraded its software to a new platform for several departments including Inspection Services. As part of the upgrade, the Department of Inspection Services now offers an expanded service which allows online permit application as an option for licensed contractors to submit an application for limited work types involving Heating, Ventilating and Air-Conditioning; Plumbing; and Electrical work.

Given current technologies and the resulting efficiencies of online permitting, there has been a strong interest from contractors who prefer to utilize online permitting rather than in-person transactions or mailing-in permits. Inspection Services is looking forward to offering this new service to its customers.

Going forward, Inspection Services will look to expand the program to allow property owners and contractors the ability to submit applications and expanded trades work permit applications online. Franklin Citizen Police Academy

Police Chief Rick Oliva has announced Class No. 29 of the Franklin Police Department Citizen Police Academy which will begin Thursday, September 2, 2021, for 12 consecutive weeks, and conclude on Thursday, November 18, 2021, with a graduation ceremony. Classes meet on Thursday evenings from 6:30 p.m. to 9 p.m., usually in the Franklin Police Department community classroom. Additionally,



community classroom. Additionally, each graduate may participate in a ride-along with officers on the street.

The Franklin Police Department's mission is to establish and maintain a course of instruction for citizens to familiarize themselves with the operations of the Franklin Police Department and the profession of law enforcement. This 12week academy presents an overview of all aspects of law enforcement such as patrol operations, traffic enforcement, investigations, SWAT, K-9 unit, dispatch/communications, fire and emergency medical services, and much more. Students will have an opportunity to present concerns and questions regarding public safety in the City and learn how citizens and the police can work together to fight crime in the community. Department employees present each session and interact with participants on a very approachable level—the aim is to inform, instruct, and involve citizens.

Applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Live or work in the Franklin community (preference is given to Franklin citizens).
- Submit a written application.
- Pass a background check (no felony convictions).
- Be 18 years of age (16 and 17 year olds may attend with parent or guardian).

There is no cost to attend; however, class size is limited. If interested in attending, contact Sergeant Jason Fincel at jfincel@franklinwi.gov. Applications are available in the Franklin Police Department lobby, on the Franklin Police Department Facebook page, or can be sent via email.

Franklin Fire Department Frequently Asked Questions:



How many calls does the Franklin Fire Department (FFD) respond to each year? In 2020, the department responded to 4,451 total calls for service. Approximately 80% were for Emergency Medical Services (EMS). All FFD personnel are crosstrained, dual-role Firefighters and EMT/Paramedics.

Do the Firefighters work 24-hour shifts? Yes, Franklin Firefighters are on duty for 24 hours at a time. The department has three shifts that rotate in order to provide around-the-clock protection every day of the year! The Firefighters average 56 hours-per-week on duty.

I called 911 for an ambulance, why did a fire engine respond? All Franklin fire engines are staffed with dual-role Firefighters/ Paramedics and carry a full array of advanced life support gear including a cardiac monitor/defibrillator, medications, airway management, and trauma care supplies. Because our ambulances are busy, a fire engine may be closest and arrive quicker to begin patient care. The additional paramedics arriving on the fire engine also provide support in quickly and efficiently managing the care of a critical patient.

What are the requirements to become a Firefighter with the FFD? Applicants must possess these minimum requirements: be at least 18 years of age, excellent health and physical condition, high school diploma, drivers license. Wisconsin Firefighter L



license, Wisconsin Firefighter Level II certification and Nationally Registered, State licensed EMT-Paramedic. The department offers lateral transfer opportunities for experienced applicants.

Are you a senior who has returned to your normal activities following the COVID restrictions and found your balance and strength have suffered? Consider attending a **Stepping On Workshop**. Stepping On is an evidence-based workshop for seniors that helps them identify risks for falls and ways to prevent them. Research has found that people who completed the workshop reduce their risk of falls by 31%.

During the seven weekly sessions, guest experts bring insight and participants bring experience. Trained leaders bring it all together making it fun. A physical therapist introduces exercises that are specific to improving balance and strength. Awareness of hazards in the home and community, changes in vision, effects of medications, and even the selection of footwear can reduce the risk of falling.

This in-person workshop will run Thursdays, October 14 through December 2, 2021 (no class November 25th). It will be held in the Fadrow Room at the Franklin Public Library from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m. There is a \$10 registration fee and you will receive a free ankle weight to use and keep. The workshop has a limited number of openings to allow the necessary social distancing. Participants are asked to provide their own water. To register, call Carol Sibilski at 414-427-7535.
