Welcome Neighbors,

Our City of Franklin Parks play a vital role in the community, providing social, economic, and well-being to our residents. As our City continues to grow, planners, elected officials, and community advocates are taking a fresh look at parks and their potential to help address environmental benefits and public health issues.

We believe that everyone should have access to quality parks that provide affordable recreation opportunities in a clean, safe, and healthy environment. The park is a place where people come to relax and reap the benefits of nature — from peaceful morning walks to memorable family picnics, local parks have so much to offer — and litter gets in the way of that. It is important to us, and as a community to keep them clean. Cleanliness plays a vital role in keeping our parks pretty and appealing.

Ultimately, litter has environmental, social and economic consequences, all of which can negatively impact our park and community. Additionally, if animals ingest litter, it can lead to health hazards across wildlife species that are common in our parks. In reality, litter can create both water and soil pollution, directly impacting nature and nearby bodies of water like rivers and lakes and travel to our waterways via storm drains.

Help Keep Our Parks Beautiful...

The City of Franklin Department of Public Works & Highway provides the manpower and supplies necessary to properly maintain all City parks. This encompasses 242 acres of park land, 5.1 miles of bike trails, and 20 community recreational park sites.

IT'S IMPORTANT FOR ALL TO CONTRIBUTE IN KEEPING OUR PARKS CLEAN AND WELCOMING.

Pavilion Rental

A permit is required to reserve pavilions and picnic areas. **In person** Reservations (only) on a first-come, first-serve basis, through the City of Franklin Clerk's Office Franklin City Hall, 9229 W. Loomis Road, 8:00 am-4:30 pm. No phone, email, online, or mail-in applications are accepted.

Park Permit applications are accepted for Franklin groups or residents beginning on the first business day in January of each year. Applications are accepted for all other groups beginning on the first business day in April of each year. Visit www.franklinwi.gov > parks for policies and info. on how to reserve a park.

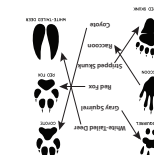
